25 tiny moments to walk your kids toward Christmas

A short prayer, a real Bible verse, and a kid-friendly reflection — for December 1 through Christmas Day.

Advent is not a race to the presents. It's 25 slow days of remembering that Jesus came near — as a baby, in a barn, on purpose.

This little printable is made for families with kids ages 3-8. Each day has one short reflection (about 80 words), one real Bible verse (WEB translation), and one 2-line prayer you can whisper together at bedtime or over hot cocoa.

Some days will feel like magic. Others will feel like herding cats. Both count. God is not measuring your delivery — He is meeting your children in the ordinary.

Start on December 1. If you fall behind, don't restart — pick up where you are. Advent is not a streak. It's a walk.

May Jesus feel near this month.

Joseph Says Yes Too

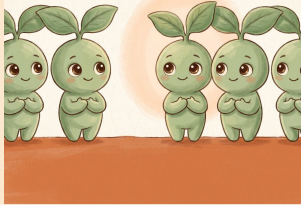

Baby Jesus Is Here

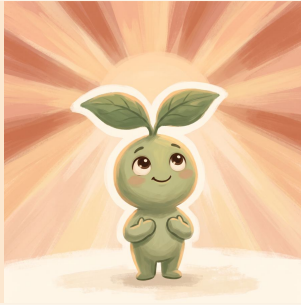
